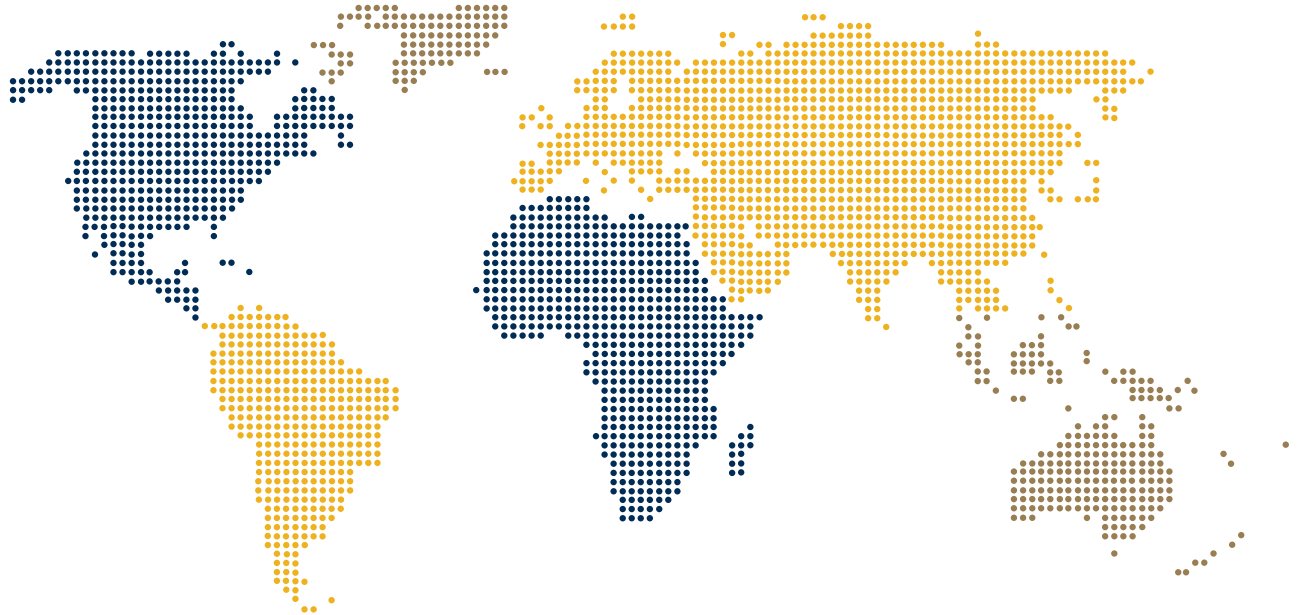

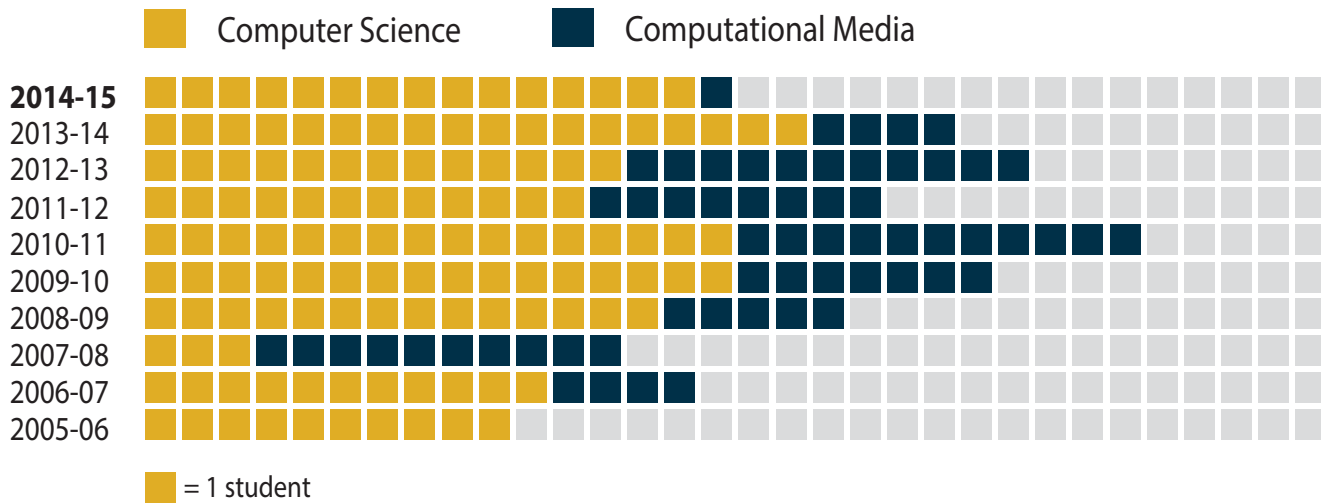

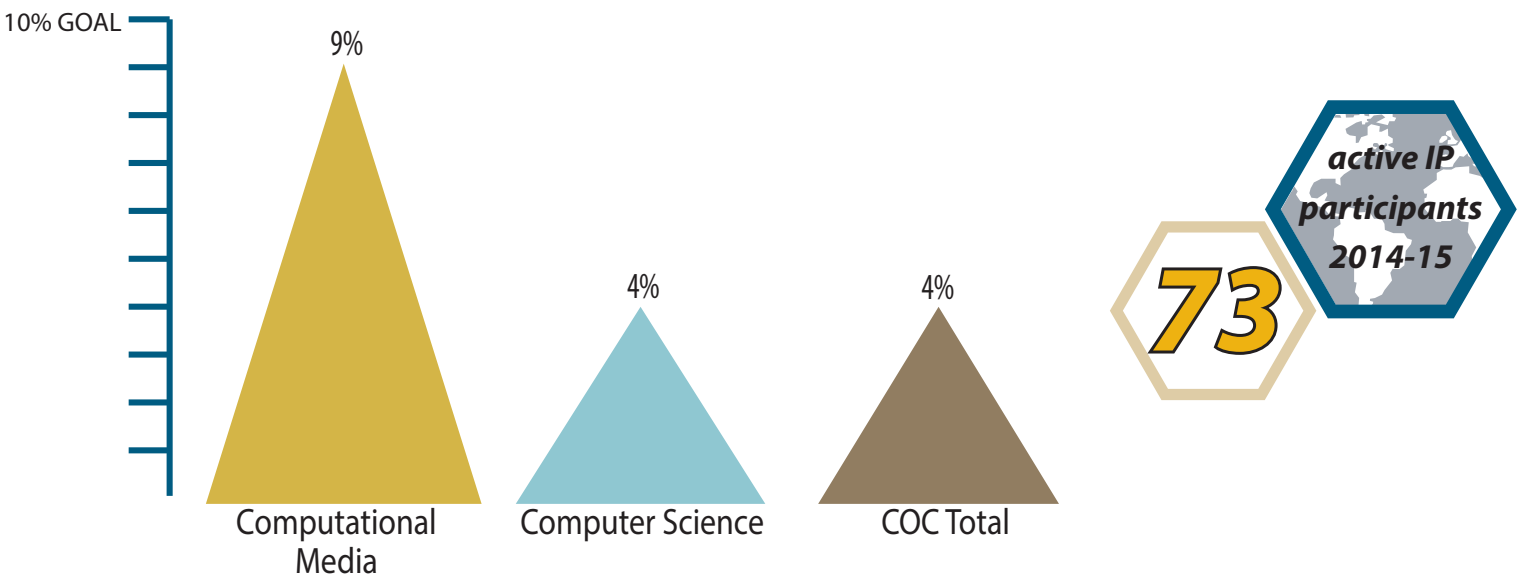

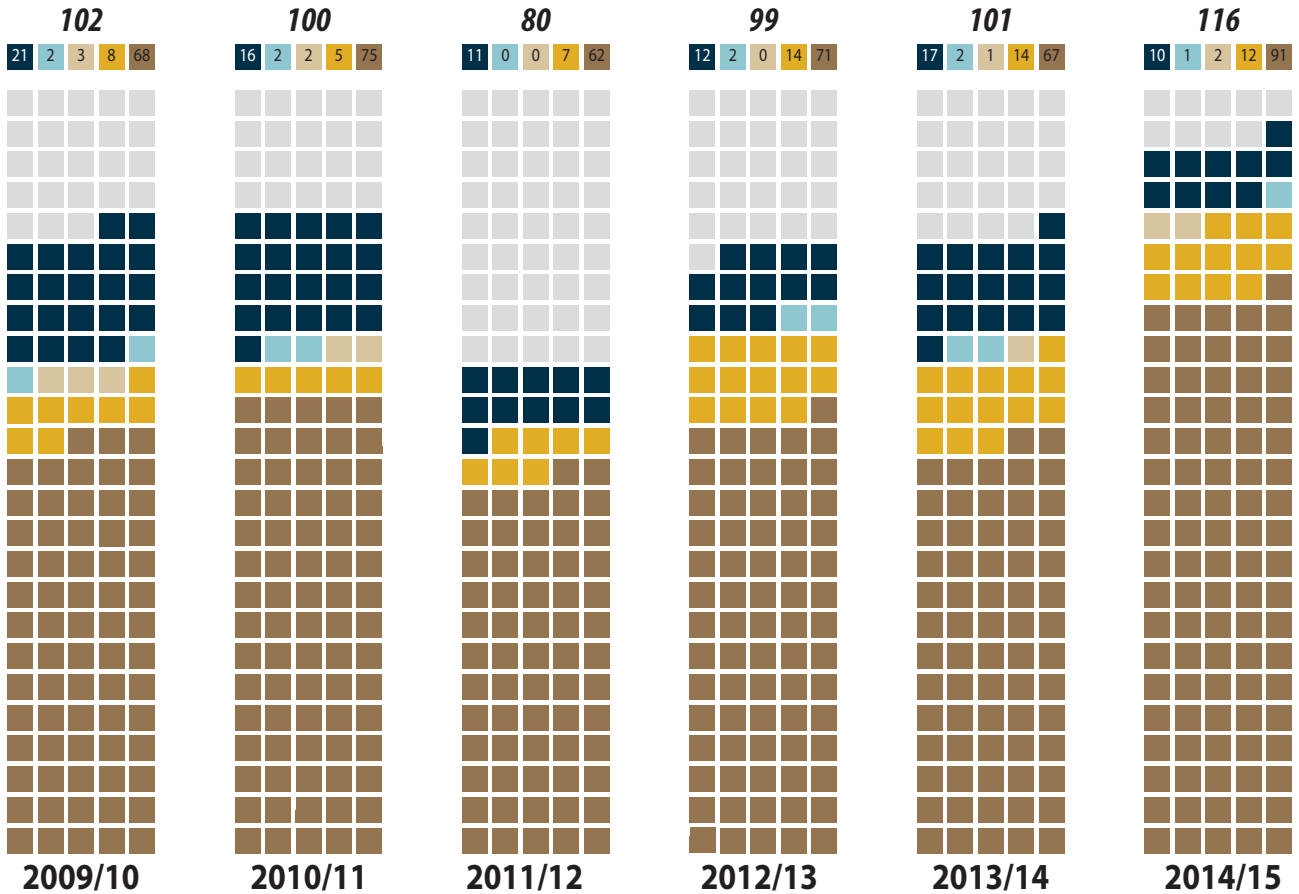
COC: IP Participation as a Percentage of Enrollment, by Major

■ Intern Abroad ■ Non-GT ■ Academic Projects ■ Exchange ■ Faculty-Led Program

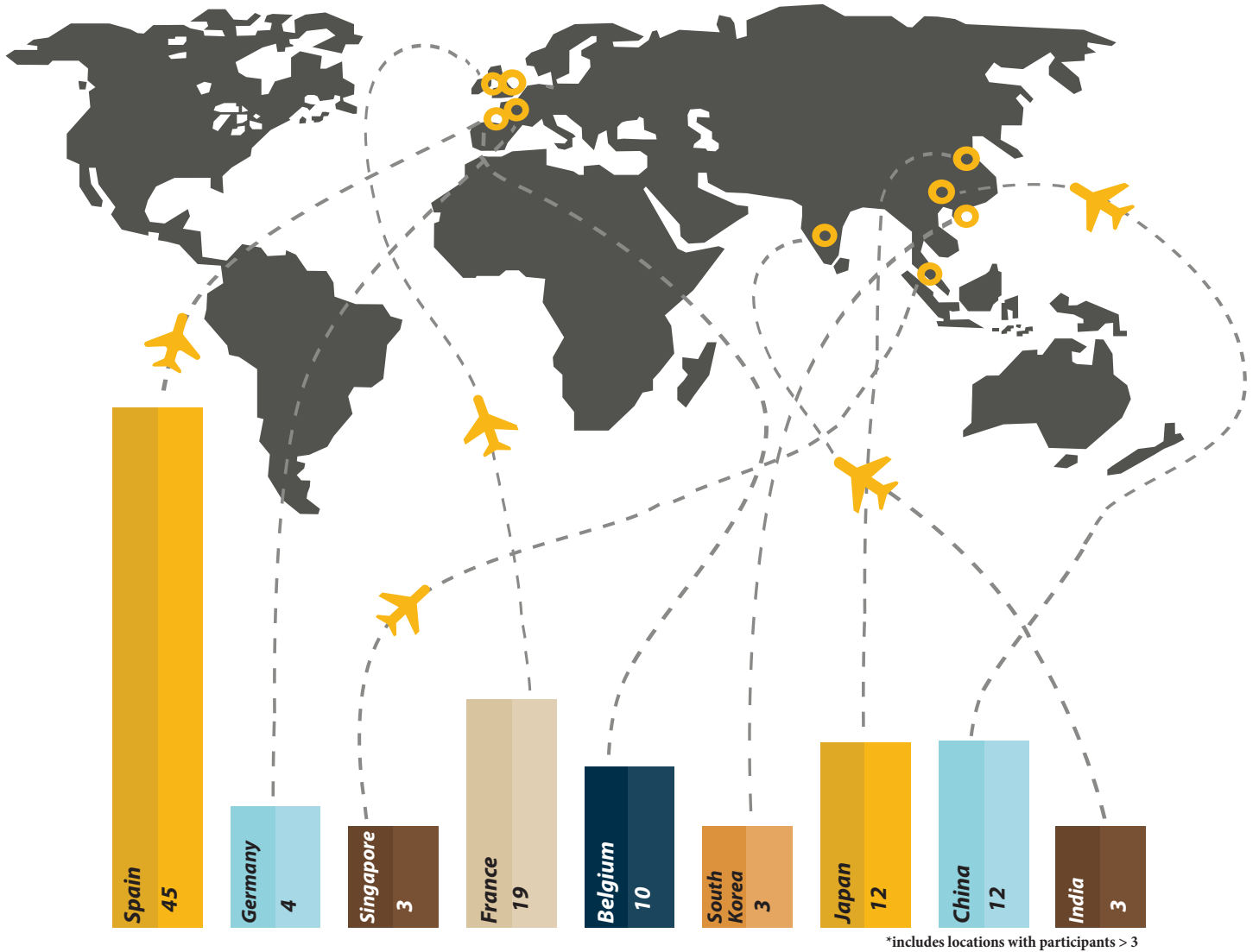

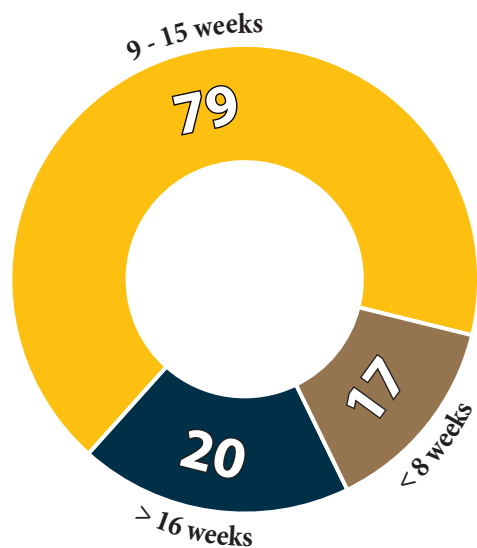


COC students participated in 12 faculty-led study abroad programs and 8 exchanges at partner universities.

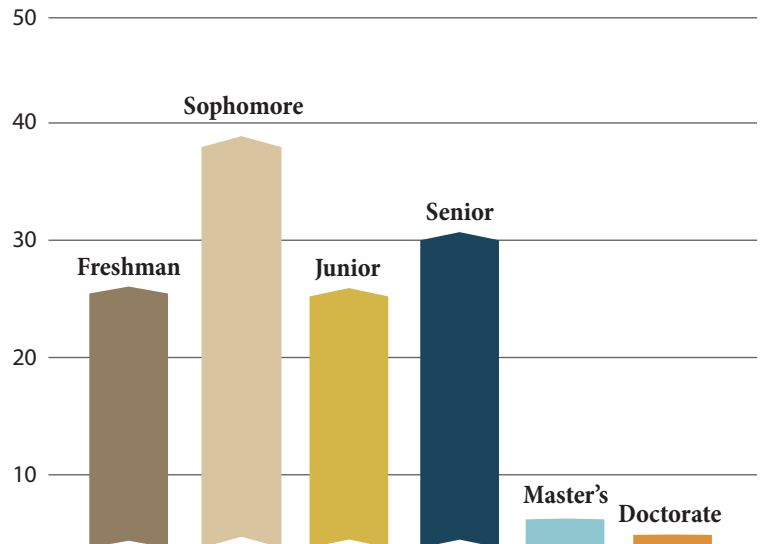
COC: Participants Abroad by Location, 2014-15*

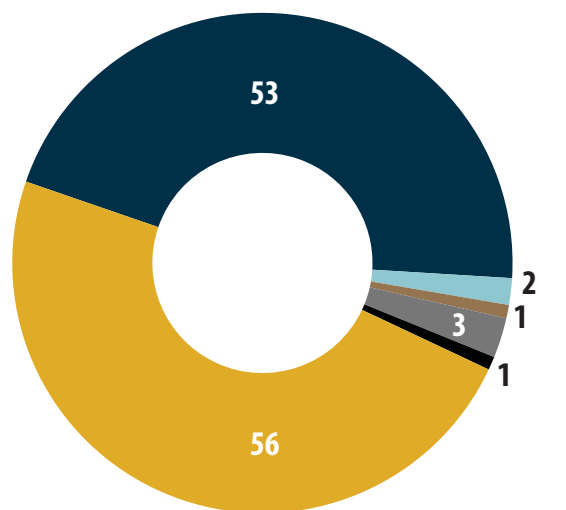

COC: Participants Abroad by Race, 2014-15

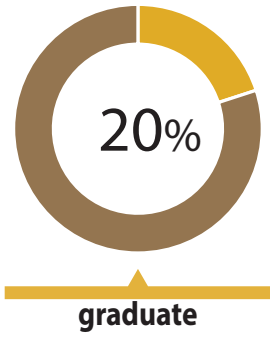
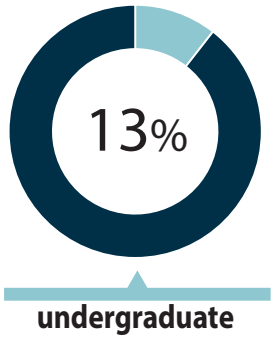

Percentage of enrolled COC students who are international

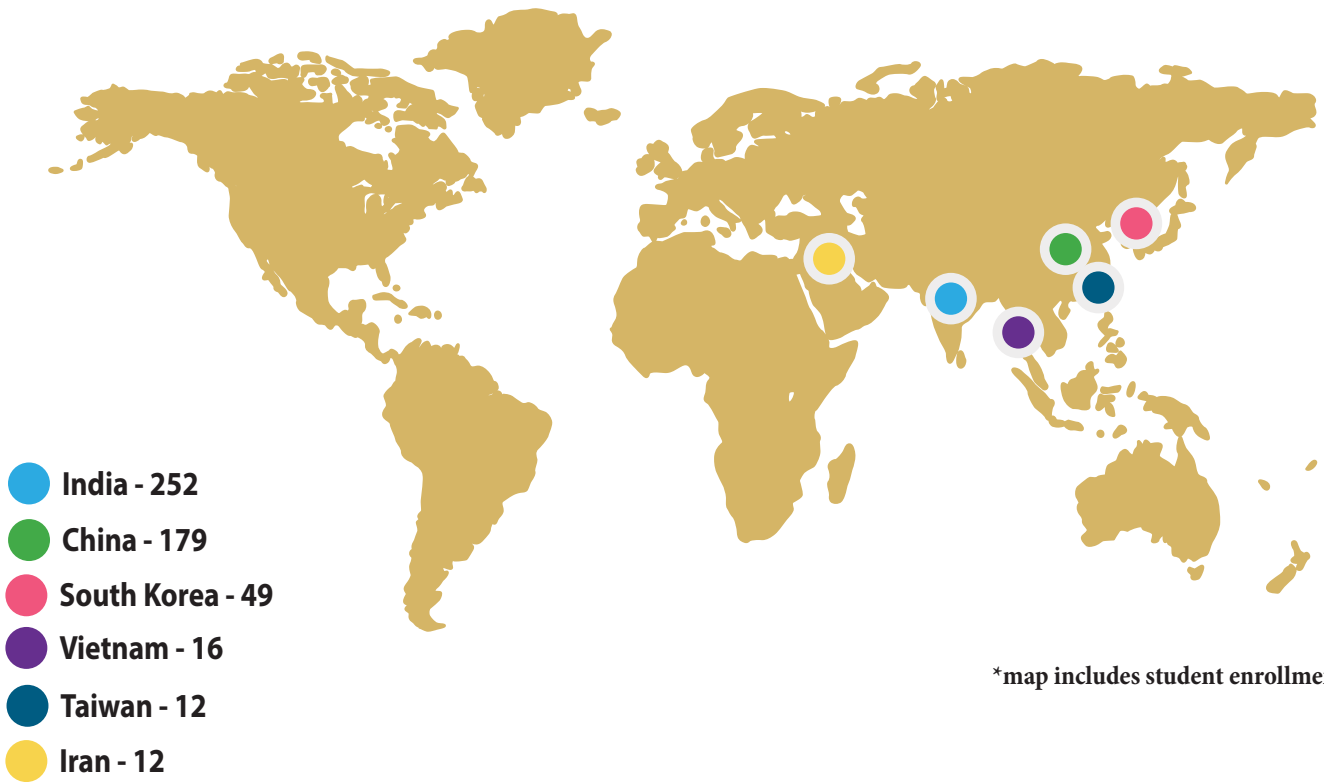

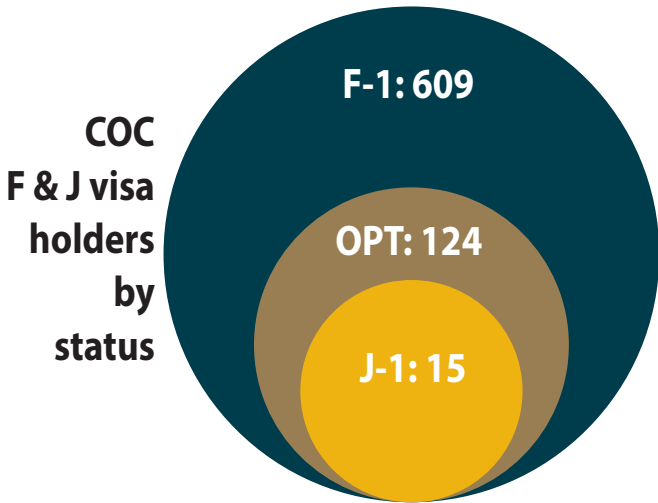

COC: International Student Citizenship (F & J Visa Holders), 2014-15*



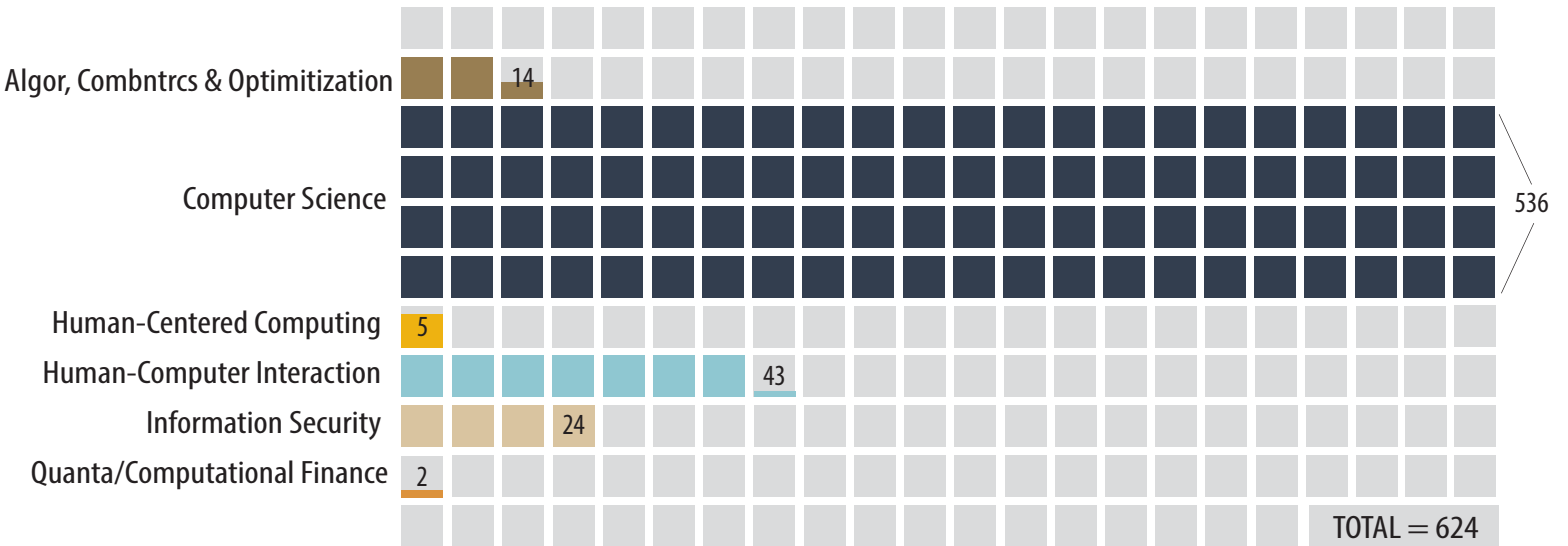

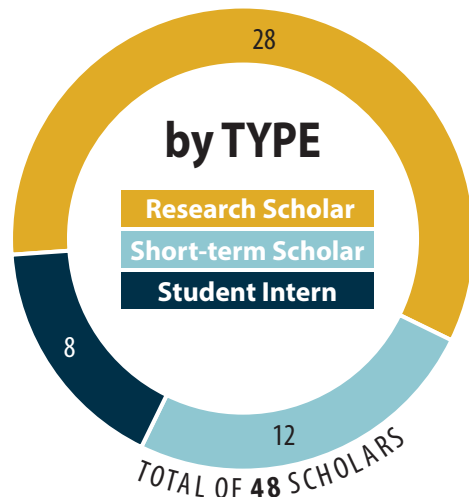
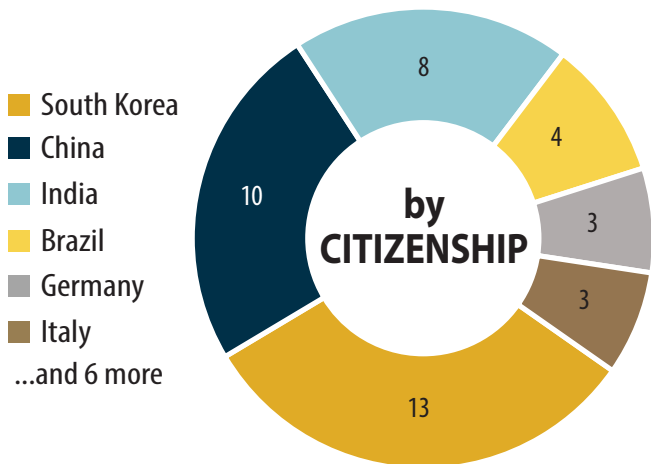
COC international students by gender

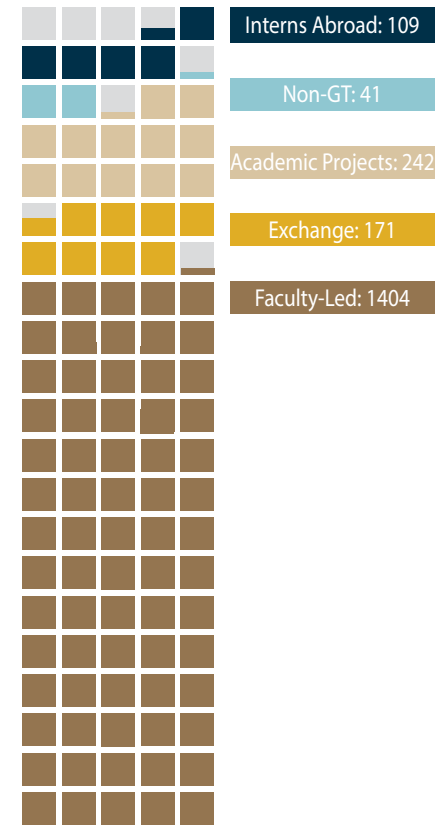

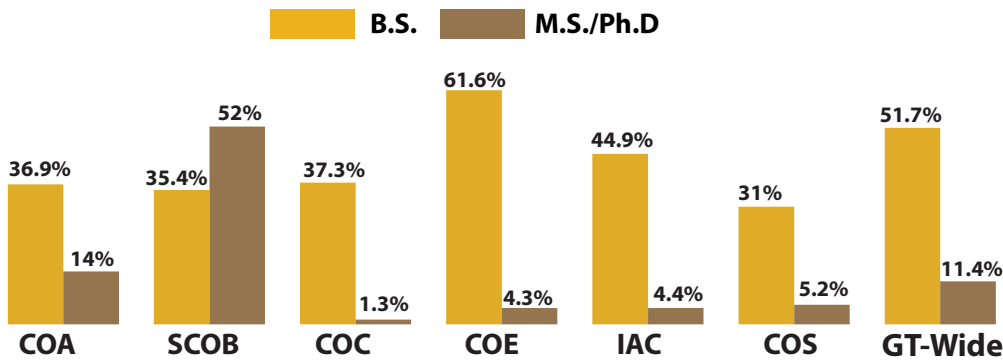


Participants abroad 2014-15 by program type

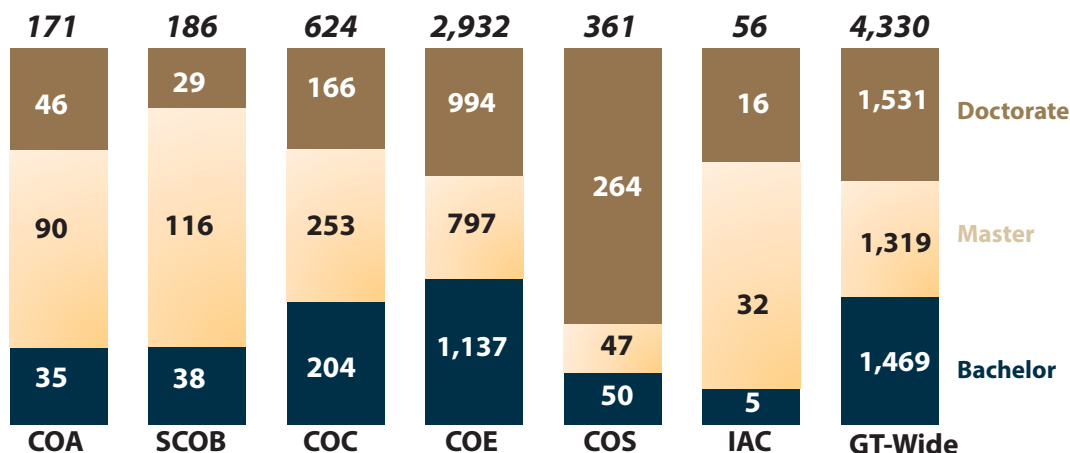
